With love and sadness, we announce that our dear Brina Hollander Krupp, 78, passed away on Sunday, January 21, 2024, while on a Caribbean cruise in Dominica.

Brina was born and raised in Miami, Florida. She graduated from Emory University as a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and taught French and Spanish for over 35 years in Maryland public schools. In retirement, Brina enjoyed mahjong, her community book club, and travel adventures with her husband of 55 years, Brian Krupp of Lewes, DE. She was also an active member of P.E.O. (Philanthropic Educational Organization), an organization for advancing women's education. Brina was always a positive person and was there for everyone.

In addition to her husband Brian, Brina is survived by daughters: Nikki (Chris) Donohue of Newark, DE, and Farah (Jason) Kauffman of Lancaster, PA.; her grandchildren: Erin, Sam, and Jasper; and sister Doreen (Murray) Snyder of Edgewater, MD.

A small, private funeral service will be held at Parsell Funeral Home, with interment immediately following at St. Peter's cemetery, in Lewes, Delaware.
